Tuesday, August 8 – FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL FOR STUDENTS:

- **Building will open at 7:25 a.m.** Grade PK3-8th grade parents may walk their child to class. Due to safety protocols, **after the first day, only PK3-PK4-Kinder parents may walk children to class and ONLY on the first 3 days.**
- **No morning care on the first day, but there will be After Care.** Please be sure to register for both morning and afternoon care, if needed!
- **Morning care will open on Wednesday, August 9, at 6:30 a.m.** for registered students.
- **After care will open on the first day, August 8, for registered students.**
- **School dismisses at 3:00 p.m.** Please be prepared to wait approximately an hour for us to load students into vehicles. This is typical for the first day and we request your patience and your attention to the traffic directors. Time will improve in just a few days as your children learn our procedures. **Safety is our biggest concern at dismissal – please be patient!**

- **Other Important Dates/News for the First Few Weeks:**

- **The first week of school has only 3 student days** due to scheduled professional development by the Catholic Schools Office for staff. Students will attend August 8-9-10 (T-W-TH). There will not be school on Friday, August 11. **Students will return to school on Monday, August 14.**
- **Hot lunches will be served on the first day of school.** Please be alert to an email sent during the last week of July to pre-order hot lunch for the first few weeks of school.
- **Our first school mass will be Thursday, August 10, 8:00am**, for K-8th. Mass uniforms are not required.
- **The “Feast of St. Helen” will be celebrated on Friday, August 18, and it will be our first school mass for grades K-8.** Students should wear mass uniforms and bring a small piece of wood to commemorate St. Helen’s finding of the True Cross of Jesus (more information to come later).
- **On Thursday, August 31, we will host an Open House for all grade levels, 5-6:30 p.m.** Come tour your child’s classrooms and view some student work!
- **Friday, September 1, will be our first early release day** to give you a head start to Labor Day! Early dismissal is at noon and we will have after care open.

Our award-winning staff and Advisory Council welcome you to St. Helen Catholic School and “the Sainthood!” May you all have a safe, happy, and fun summer. We pray that God blesses you abundantly!
