



The President's Volunteer Service Award

The President's Volunteer Service Award is a prestigious national award that is given to recognize the valuable contributions volunteers are making in our communities and to encourage more people to volunteer. This award was created to thank and honor volunteers who, by their demonstrated commitment and example, inspire others to engage in volunteer service to serve the community. This award can be earned by students and adults by logging your volunteer service hours with signatures from activity/event coordinator and meeting the following criteria:

Volunteer Eligibility

- United States citizen or lawful permanent resident of the United States (verifiable by document)
- Must be at least five years old
- Completes eligible service within a 12-month period (4/16/24 – 4/15/25)
- Service activity must be signed by volunteer supervisor/event coordinator and recorded in PVSA service log
- PVSA 2024-2025 must include some general community service volunteer activity

Eligible Service: (promote civic engagements)

- Unpaid acts of volunteer service benefitting others or helping in the community
- Food Drive (ie SVDP food fair, Houston food bank)
- Shelters (ie animal shelter, womens shelter, Kidz harbor)
- Nursing Homes (ie make cards/gift packets for patients, sing for, volunteer)
- Hospital (ie make cards/gift packets for patients, sing for, volunteer in hospital library)
- Fundraiser event (ie volunteer in a walk/run or assist with non-profit fundraiser event)
- School volunteer (ie assist teachers, HSA/PTA projects, Girl Scout lead, class/school event, chaperone)
- Community Projects (ie Make Pearland Beautiful)

In-Eligible Service:

- Church/Religious worship (ie mass choir, choir practice for mass, altar server, lector, EM, acolyte, bible study)
- Religious instruction (CCE, Faith Formation youth group ministry, RCIA, religious camps/retreats)
- Proselytizing (activities that promote religion)
- Political lobbying
- Donating funds/money
- Volunteer service performed as part of court-ordered community service
- Serving only family members
